

ADMINISTRATIVE POLICIES OF THE MILWAUKEE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY 4.03 SECURITY

(1) BUILDING AND GROUNDS

- (a) The school safety program shall include a uniform plan for:
1. the reporting of disruptive acts, of all incidents of crime in the schools, and of serious breaches of behavior regulations;
 2. the analysis of who, what, when, and where, as related to criminal acts and other serious problems;
 3. the improvement of law and regulations enforcement as needed;
 4. inservice activities for staff; and
 5. detailed physical improvements required to adequately safeguard the facilities, students, staff, and assets of the district.

(b) The Board also authorizes the Administration to meet with appropriate representatives of the Milwaukee Police Department to explore and develop a liaison program between the Milwaukee Public Schools and the police department. It authorizes the superintendent to work with the city attorney's office to develop ordinances that address the problem of providing a safe school environment.

(c) The Board endorses the concept of allowing individual schools to formulate individual school security plans. The local school governance body of each school shall advise the school administrator on school discipline, security, and safety matters.

(d) An ongoing school safety and security committee shall be created consisting of union personnel, field administrators, the safety director, the facility planner, and other appropriate field administrators and Central Services personnel.

(2) VANDALISM

(a) All residents of the city, students, and members of the police and sheriff's departments are urged by the Board to cooperate in reporting any incidents of vandalism to property belonging to the public schools, along with the name(s) of the person or persons believed to be responsible. Each employee of the school system shall be expected to report to the principal of the school every incident of vandalism known to him or her, and, if known, the names of those responsible.

(b) The Board shall also make provisions, within reasonable limitations, through self-insurance on the part of the Board, to protect all employees of the Milwaukee Public Schools against loss or damage to personal property used in the course of their employment arising from theft, fire, or willful damage.

(c) Parents of children who damage school property shall be expected to fully reimburse the district for such damage.
